

Dr. Zoot & The Suits

At first the band was just a steady weekday gig in 1998 at a small swing club in Pittsburgh's south side, just a side project. All the musicians had good weekend work in other bands. But the band grew in popularity and soon they were packin' em in. The crowd listened to Dr Zoot but Dr Zoot also listened to the crowd and were exposed to new influences. The dancers and musicians came every week, it became a scene. Sal began writing originals for the band and encouraged the other musicians to write horn charts or



chord changes and bring them to rehearsal. Ideas flowed freely, and the new songs and arrangements were really happening. It became everybody's main band. Week after week the band rehearsed, wrote and gigged.

The band knocks em dead regularly from the Showboat Casino in Atlantic City NJ to Jimmy Buffets Margaritaville in Key west FL and fine clubs and venues in between.

J.D EICHER & THE GOODNIGHTS

A radio ready, polished sound with literate songwriting and intimate, swoon-worthy vocals has the Herald Standard ranking the album with Pittsburgh's elite, saying that *Shifting* is "the best album from a local band since 'Restless Days' (The Clarks). Seriously, it's that good." Forging their diverse musical backgrounds, JD Eicher (vocals/guitar), Dan Prokop (keys), Jim Merhaut (bass), and Ryan Kirk (drums/percussion) combine seasoned songwriting, rich vocals, melodic arrangements, and emphatic delivery to establish their own brand of "subtle pop." They've created an album that has "the light, poppy quality of British bands Keane or The Script which has done plenty of damage on the airwaves but with more detail in the songwriting," says the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette.

Produced by Paul Barber (My Favorite Highway, The Bigger Lights, The Friday Night Boys), *Shifting* is the manifestation of the band's musical exploration and growth since the last record. "These guys can play," notes Barber, "that's what made the sessions really rewarding." Beyond the quartet's growth as musicians, the theme of 'shifting' appears in the underlying emphasis on change in the songs, Eicher's evolution as a songwriter, and the band's ability to shift seamlessly between various styles, giving the album a "mainstream likability that is both charming and contagious," praises the HeraldStandard.

Jimmy Adler



The Jimmy Adler Band is built around the blues guitar playing of Jimmy Adler. Throughout the years, he has played with a variety of Pittsburgh blues bands. Adler and singer Larry Nath started The Mohicans back in 1988 and played every Tuesday night at the now defunct BACKROOM on East Carson Street in Pittsburgh's Historic Southside. The band eventually dissolved and Adler moved on to Eugene and The Night Crawlers. At this point he also played for two years at Natili's in their Wednesday night house band, The Mojos, featuring Eugene Morgan, John Burgh, Randy Roth, Tom "little Buck" Coyle, and Adler on guitar. Eventually Adler got the call to work full-time with Gary Belloma and the Blue Bombers. He recorded one album, Pack Your 'Chute with the band and stayed from 1998-2002. At this time, he felt it was important to be fronting his own band and playing his brand of blues that emphasized the voice of his guitar. Jill West, Gary Belloma, and Billy Price had all allowed Adler to sing a song or two during his time with those bands and the desire to lead his own band began to grow. With great anticipation the crowd welcomed Abby and his new band to the stage with a thunderous cheer on Saturday night at the Pepsi Cola Roadhouse in Burgettstown, PA.



Scott Blasey started playing music in 1986 with three guys named Rob, Greg, and Dave. They formed the Clarks at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, where we were honored as "Distinguished Alumni" in 2004, and spent the last twenty years traveling around the country preaching our brand of rock-n-roll salvation. He was born in Connellsville, PA the year the Beatles came to America. He was the first one on his block to have a boombox. He saw Tom Petty at the Stanley Theater in 1980 and knew what I had to do.

The Laurels

The Laurels are the story of Dick Muse, a McKeesport doo-wopper who started out in 1956 with the Condors, whom he met through a connection he knew at US Steel's National Tube Works where he worked in the summers. The Laurels' discovery grew with the single "Honey I Love You," b/w "So Much In Love" (a cappella), the EP "Barbara/Lonely/Summer/Hydrogen Bomb/Crying in the Chapel," and a final single, "When I'm With You" b/w "Truthfully." The band was made up of Dick Muse, Lonnie Brown, Jeff King, Jim Baker and Larry Davis and once again became the Laurels. Later Tony Santaguido of the El Monics and afterward, the Marcels, joined the cast.

Car Show







10K / 5K RUN and 5K COMPETITIVE WALK






Ten years later


The memorial was conceived and designed to make no political statement about the war. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is a place where everyone can come together to remember and honor those who served.

John R. Bennett a surviving war veteran talked to the Scottdale Fall Festival about his war memories. He enlisted in 1944 at the age of 21 years old. He went with the navy because he knew it would be more interesting to see the world from the ship. John was in World War II and part of the Korean War. He was discharged from World War II January 26, 1946 and the Korean War May 18th, 1951. The first ship that he was on was called the US1 Wantuck. The ship was named after a fallen marine killed during World War II. While on that ship John was a gunners mate, then moved to damage control. In the Korean War John was on the USA Colbort and was damage control third class. When not on active duty they would scrub the boats and clean the insides of the ships. "They were a very nice piece of work after we were all done" said Bennett. Also they would go swimming in the ocean. "We only had to worry about the sharks, which we ran in to a couple times." John received a few ribbons and medals which include, The Philippine liberation ribbon, pacific theatre ribbon with two stars, American theatre ribbon, and the victory medal. The American Theater of World War II was considered a military area of World War II operations encompassing the mainland United States and extended to the middle of the Atlantic Ocean. The area also encompassed Alaska, Canada, and parts of the Baja California Peninsula, and the Pacific Coast. While on the ships he visited many places and saw many things. He remembers going to Okinawa and Tokyo, Japan. The one thing John remembers the most is seeing the Japan Instrument of Surrender September 2 1945 (The Peace Treaty with Japan). His ship was the flag ship, which means the US1 Wantuck carried General Douglas MacArthur to the Ship USS Missouri to have him sign the peace treaty. John is a active member of the American Legion and Moose. John has been a member of the Mount Pleasant American Legion for 65 years now and he happily resides in Mount Pleasant with his wife Jane and their children and grandchildren.

Jacobs Creek Watershed Association - From the Ridge to the River

Did you know that the Jacobs Creek Watershed Association actually had its beginnings in Scottsdale Borough many, many years ago? Back in the 1950's and 1960's, severe flooding was occurring in Scottsdale Borough. You may remember it first-hand or you might have seen photos of people in rowboats along the Borough streets. A group of dedicated folks decided to band together to address the flooding and formed JCWA. It took several years and much hard work, but the JCWA founders accomplished their goal. Three flood control dams were created because of their efforts: the Acme Dam, the Bridgeport Dam and the Greenlick Dam. Few people realize that these three great fishing, boating and birding places are part of a massive flood control project that continues to prevent flooding and protect the residents of Scottsdale Borough and the surrounding areas.

Since severe flooding is no longer a problem, JCWA now focuses on completing environmental improvement projects throughout the watershed, including many in the Scottsdale area. JCWA joined with Scottsdale Borough, Westmoreland Conservation District and the Scottsdale Public Library to complete the lovely rain garden area just outside of the library. This beautiful reading, sitting and meeting area is constructed of porous pavement that absorbs rain water like a sponge, preventing heavy rains from surging into streams and causing erosion. Rain water from the library roof drains are also collected and used for watering the flowers. JCWA has just completed similar storm water runoff improvements in the parking lot behind the Southwest Regional Tax Bureau office along Spring and Mulberry streets. In 2012, JCWA will partner with the Scottsdale Firemen's Club to complete the same type of improvements to address storm water in its parking lot.


