

In his retirement, he decided to put together a Frankenstein group with a mysterious drummer and a bombastic guitar player named Shawn. Oh, and Jason Cursi played congas with them too. After a 10 year Spinal-Tappish quest for a drummer with their band Ahab and distractions such as college and solo projects, Joe and Tony learned of Chuck's passing and decided to put together a tribute concert in his memory. Yeah, Jason played that too. The boys had so much fun that they just had to carry on. Abacus Jones was born.


# 10K / 5K RUN and 5K COMPETITIVE WALK

He was listed in the Who's Who in American Law enforcement in 1972 and 1980. Also, in 1982 he would receive an outstanding commendation award from the American police Hall of fame.






