



Gwen joined the variety band Protégé in 2003 and, with this group, she has shared the stage with the Temptations, the Supremes, and Jackie Evancho.



MIKE LATHOM first discovered his vocal talent during his teenage years when he won his high school talent show. Since then he has sung with several groups including Soul'd Out, Common Thread, Weets All Stars, and William Dell and the Wee Jams. Mikey also performs with "Pure Gold" and at private parties and various local venues.

JOSEPHINE CROOKS is no stranger to the Pittsburgh music scene. She has appeared with the Pittsburgh Musical Theater in Miss Saigon, with John Holt Productions in Best of Broadway, Lady Legends, Divas and Divas Together Again. You may have seen Josie fronting local bands Dancing Queen, Spectrum, Protégé. Persephone's Dream, and The Holidays. She has recorded several songs in Nashville and was recorded on the 3WS Home for the Holidays Volume II album. Josie was a finalist in the Pittsburgh Symphony Pops Search for a Star talent contest.

SHEENA B Sheena has sung in bands of many genres in Pittsburgh and around the country including jazz, big band, rock, variety, show tunes, and club dance. The latter included an international tour with Atlantic Records recording group, Company B, who had three hit songs on the Billboard Dance charts, guest appearances on Showtime at the Apollo, MTV, and beat out Michael Jackson at the Boston Dance Music Awards for favorite group.

Pierce Dipner and the Shades Of Blue

Pierce Dipner is a young Blues Musician and multi-instrumentalist from Pittsburgh, PA. At the young age of 8 he started to play the guitar and sing. By age nine he was also playing bass, drums, and cello. At 11 he discovered the Blues at a Youth Blues jam hosted by the Blues Society of Western PA and he has been hooked ever since. At the age of 13 he was selected by the BSWPA to perform in the 2017 International Blues Challenge in Memphis, Tennessee where he got to showcase his talents at Mr. Handy's Blues Hall on Beale Street.



In the summer of 2018, Pierce formed his first band, Pierce
Dipner and the Shades Of Blue. The band offers an eclectic and personalized mix of originals and covers of
Blues, Rock, and Soul favorites. Pierce as a solo artist has opened for Nick Moss. Likewise, Pierce and his
band have opened for Brandon 'Taz' Niederauer and Albert Cummings. Case in point: Pierce's debut EP,
"Get Out Of Your Life" comprises 4 tracks (3 originals and a classic cover) featuring Pierce with his band.
The EP is gaining international airplay, receiving great reviews, and is featured on many Blues charts.





This BIGFOOT chassis is the newest member of the Team BIGFOOT fleet. Scottdale Public Library



One hundred and eleven years ago, November 7, 1910, The Scottdale Public Library became a living institution in our community. It came into being on March 23, 1910 when A.L. Keister, formally presented the community with the gift of a library. The original gift, was soon supplemented by funds provided by the Scottdale School Board and became a key to the provision of a wealth of information and services to the communities it served.

The library's first home was in the Scottdale High School, providing access to both students and adults. Miss Daisy Mary Smith was the first Librarian

In 1921 Scottdale Borough realizing "the great worth of the library", voted to help support the library and found a temporary home at the Funaro Building until the library moved into the second floor of the Hurst – Cook building on November 1, 1922. The library's next home was across

Pittsburgh Street where it remained until August of 2008 when the library built its permanent residence at 106 Spring Street. The present library has become a true hub of the community while reaching out to serve Everson Borough, East Huntingdon Township and Upper Tyrone Township. While boards and staff have changed through the years the goals and objectives of the library remain constant; providing services and programming for the communities it serves with equal access to all. The public library is a great equalizer. The collection is both popular and diverse. There is literally something for everyone at the library.

2020 was a trying year for the world and for our library. While ordered to shut down, we were able to provide over 100 virtual programs, reference and curbside services. Our free extended WIFI was enjoyed by many from their cars as children participated in virtual schooling.

In August of 2020, we were devastated by the unexpected passing of our beloved children's librarian, Rhonda Allison. Rhonda will always be remembered for presenting virtual story time from the kitchen of her personal residence. By interacting with children and giving them a taste of the familiar during the pandemic, she gave the communities children a memory they will likely never forget.

Traditions are important to small towns and we hope a visit to the library will always be a tradition for the wonderful residents of our area. In keeping with the theme of traditions, please stop by the library and view the 20 years of summer reading tee shirt quilt in the Beth Ann Johnson Children's Room. The quilt was created by Ruthann Bigley, in memory of her sister Rhonda Allison and represents 20 years of special programs presented by the library.

Scottdale Historical Society

For over a century, downtown has hosted many Scottdale traditions. From Scottdale's 25th anniversary to the Scottdale Fall Festival today, hundreds of parades have passed up and down Pittsburgh Street and Broadway, and although the look of downtown has changed, the sense of community and pride these events bring remain the same.

Scottdale has always valued its traditions, celebrations, and the memories behind them. In 1899, the town celebrated its first major anniversary, 25 years. Or, a quadranscentennial, for those who like six-syllable words. In those days, our town

looked much different. Two sides of Pittsburgh Street and Broadway were lined with grocery and hardware stores, barber shops, banks, churches, homes, hotels, bars, and more. Parades marched past new eclectic streetlights, along brick-cladded streets and the one-mile paved portion of Broadway. The Pittsburgh Press reported, "Here the busy hum and whirling wheels of industry are heard on every hand." Nearly 15,000 citizens gathered to celebrate the town's first major anniversary and regional firemen's convention held at Ellsworth Park that year.


Fast forward 75 years, and Scottdale was celebrating its Semi-sequicentennial. Along the way, many new traditions were born. The Fireman's Fair was held every year behind Scottdale High School and later moved downtown. Holidays brought parades and events through town. Citizens honored military past and present at new memorials and old cemeteries. People continued to gather downtown throughout the year, creating and strengthening community traditions. As Scottdale approached its 100th anniversary, or centennial, a new festival took shape in celebration of the milestone. The festival commemorated the town's heritage and tradition of getting together downtown.

Today known as the Scottdale Fall Festival, this autumn celebration still draws many people from the region to downtown Scottdale for a weekend in September. Although the area looks much different, the gazebo park and downtown streets still host the community for the weekend. Scottdale summers still begin with the Firemen's Fair downtown. The holiday season starts with the Winter Light Celebration each

December.

Although we were unable to hold many of our favorite community celebrations in 2020, we are excited to see these gatherings happening again in downtown and look forward to many more celebrations in the future including Scottdale's 150th anniversary in 2024!



As the school year passes and we encroach upon the conclusion, once again, we share in this celebration of tradition during our commencement ceremony. In this rendition, a more traditional version of Scotland the Brave is tendered as a bagpiper leads a procession of graduates to the stage.

This song has become our greatest tradition. It has come to symbolize the beginning and end of every academic year for nearly 6 decades. The Covid 19 pandemic posed challenges to these great celebrations. An abridged commencement ceremony at the conclusion of the 2020 school year brought silence to the once great processional. In September 2020, capacity limits and CDC regulations sharply paired down the crowds at our Friday night football games. As we embark upon the 2021-2022 school year, we look forward to the soundtrack of our year with the spirited tones of Scotland the Brave.


