Pierce Dipner and the Shades Of Blue



Pierce Dipner is a young Blues Musician and multi-instrumentalist from Pittsburgh, PA. At the young age of 8 he started to play the guitar and sing. By age nine he was also playing bass, drums, and cello. At 11 he discovered the Blues at a Youth Blues jam hosted by the Blues Society of Western PA and he has been hooked ever since. At the age of 13 he was selected by the BSWPA to perform in the 2017 International Blues Challenge in Memphis, Tennessee where he got to showcase his talents at Mr. Handy's Blues Hall on Beale Street.

In the summer of 2018, Pierce formed his first band, Pierce Dipner and the Shades Of Blue. The band offers an eclectic and personalized mix of originals and covers of Blues, Rock, and Soul favorites. Pierce as a solo

artist has opened for Nick Moss. Likewise, Pierce and his band have opened for Brandon 'Taz' Niederauer and Albert Cummings. Case in point: Pierce's debut EP, "Get Out Of Your Life" comprises 4 tracks (3 originals and a classic cover) featuring Pierce with his band. The EP is gaining international airplay, receiving great reviews, and is featured on many Blues charts.

Jerry B and the Bonetones

Rockin' Blues, R&B, and Soul. The members of Jerry B and the Bone Tones come from diverse musical backgrounds. All of these "young" gentlemen have 30 to 40 years experience under their belts! They just keep gettin' better. Jerry Bejger-vocals, Denny Friedline-bass & vocals, Emil Herby-guitar & vocals, Ernie McCurdy-guitar & vocals, Roger Casperson-sax, and Ken Skovenski-drums.



The Vogues

Growing up together in Turtle Creek, Pennsylvania, they were well received locally, but it took one of their early recordings "YOU'RE THE ONE" to thrust them into national acclaim. There followed a series of million seller records and albums. If you were looking for one particular personality trait that they have in common, it would have to be friendliness. They have been working together for over twenty years. THE VOGUES are an electrifying group and project this sensation to their college concert, night club and television audiences. Rock and Roll gave the group their beginning. The legitimate pop sound incorporated for their night club and college



act. Country and Western and current sound has also found its way into their repertoire. The word "vogue" means: the mode or fashion prevalent at any particular time; general favor or acceptance. THE VOGUES have worked hard and successfully to maintain a "NOW" trend while retaining their highly individualistic sound. They truly fulfill the promise of their name.

Brad Abbott is a 90's/2000's influenced singer songwriter from Jeannette Pennsylvania. Loving music from an early age, Brad picked up the guitar in high school and began performing live in 2010.

Brad would go on to take part in several bands out of Western PA, releasing 7 albums under 3 different projects, Villa Manor, Sourloon, and Brad Abbott. in 2013 Brad founded Abbott Independent Records to publish Villa Manor's "Redefined EP".




METRO

Norman Nardini

As bass player for the 1970's Pittsburgh rock n' roll band, Diamond Reo, Norman Nardini got his career started. After a very brief stay at Berklee School Of Music and more than a few special moments. Nardini played bass on "The Pennsylvania Polka" Steeler fight song. After doing an arrangement of "Dancing In The Street" that got picked up by RCA he did an arrangement of Marvin Gaye's "Ain't That Peculiar" that brought an album deal with Big Tree Records that got Diamond Reo started. A highly talented, underground group from Wheeling West Virginia, The Brett Cain Band, worked with Nardini to create some legendary



music in the late 90's that resulted in their LP, Rise. As leader of The Pittsburgh Blues Allstars, Nardini has led their performance at the Pittsburgh Blues Festival for the last 13 years, shows that have featured the best of the 'burg Shari Richards, Billy Price, Gary Beloma, Kenny Blake Mark Stutso, and Jill West. The late great Glenn Pavone played his last show with The Allstars at the Blues Fest. With Harry Bottom as Bass player and BG vovals, Mike Floccari on drumbs, and Larry Siefers on Keyboards and tenor Sax.

The Fabulous Gemtones A Vegas Style Show and Dance Band

Gwen Davis, a native of Pittsburgh, joined Leon Daniels & the El Venos in 1998 & the group recorded two music videos for WPGH TV Channel 13. The group provided backup vocals for Eddie Holman when he appeared in Pittsburgh. Gwen joined the variety band Protégé in 2003 and, with this group, she has shared the stage with the Temptations, the Supremes, and Jackie Evancho.

Mike Lathom, first discovered his vocal talent during his teenage years when he won his high school talent show. Since then he has sang with several groups including Soul'd Out, Common Thread, Weets All Stars, and William Dell and the Wee Jams. Mikey also performs with "Pure Gold" and at private parties and various local venues.

Josephine Crooks,— is no stranger to the Pittsburgh music scene. She has appeared in several musical theater productions. You may have seen Josie fronting local bands Dancing Queen, Spectrum, Protégé, Persephone's Dream and The Holidays. She has recorded several songs in Nashville and was recorded on the 3WS Home for the Holidays Volume II album.

Lindsey Fitzpatrick, has been seen across Pittsburgh and international stages for the past 10 years. She has performed at various theme parks, cruise lines and regional shows across the country. She performs locally with the Latshaw Pops Orchestra.

Nick Scanga, has performed for over 35 years. His credits include the Night Owl Band that opened for Blood Sweat and Tears, Southside Johnny and the Asbury Jukes, as well as many other bands. He is well versed in nearly all musical styles from cool jazz to the ripping guitar of Carlos Santana.

Charles Harris, is the newest member of the Gemtones, joining the band in February, 2022. He is a self-taught drummer. He has played every genre of music. His credits include being a member of the variety band, Protégé. With them he shared the stage with Jackie Evancho, the Temptations and the Supremes.



Abacus Jones

Abacus Jones met in a small club south of Pittsburgh about 15 years ago when the Materkowski brothers (Joe and Tony) went to check out a local Blues band that was all the rage. The air had a smell of Lambrusco and asbestos. Joe and Tony, who were teenagers at the time, fell in love with the vibe the band was throwin' down that night. The Chuck Ramsey Band, fronted by



Chuck himself, was a complete anomaly. Chuck was a sixty-something Motown era session bassist who had played with everybody who was anybody. In his retirement, he decided to put together a Frankenstein group with a mysterious drummer and a bombastic guitar player named Shawn (click here). Oh, and Jason Cursi played congas with them too. After a 10 year Spinal-Tappish quest for a drummer with their band Ahab and distractions such as college and solo projects, Joe and Tony learned of Chuck's passing and decided to put together a tribute concert in his memory. Yeah, Jason played that too. The boys had so much fun that they just had to carry on. Abacus Jones was born.

The 4 Jukes



The 4 Jukes is a retro dance band which plays jump, & swing styles from the late 50s to the early 60s. The band features blues, rock & roll, reggae, rockabilly, classic R&B, & some classic country. The 4JUKES have their own style. They play their tunes with their own arrangements to create a fresh sound. The band has a single 45 RPM record release of 2 songs that Mark Cyler has penned for the band.

And is getting airplay on WYEP radio!! This is a 4 piece band that can project a wide variety of styles with the ever changing instrumentation: Mark Cyler: vocals, guitar, keyboards, & harmonica. Randall Troy: vocals, lead & slide guitar. Rod Zakowski: vocals, bass guitar. Buck Johnson: drums & percussion. Together THE 4JUKES create a great time for all! So you better put on you Rock & Roll Shoes!!!

Buffalo Rose

Buffalo Rose is a wildly charismatic six-piece modern folk/Americana band from Pittsburgh, PA. They take the singer-songwriter tradition to a new level by crafting original songs which are emotive, meticulously arranged, and inspired by a world of idiosyncratic influences that never let a dull or predictable moment creep in.

Buffalo Rose's lineup of Lucy Clabby (vocals), Margot Jezerc (vocals), Bryce Rabideau (mandolin), Malcolm Inglis (dobro), Jason Rafalak (upright bass), and Shane McLaughlin (guitar, vocals) pushes itself and each other far beyond their perceived limits and blends their diverse and atypical approach to songwriting with the desire to see how unique a song can get and still feel like home. They use powerful vocal harmonies, strong playing, and an original vision to operate at every possible emotional level and put on dynamic live shows that are unforgettable experiences. They go from up and moving to sad and sweet and back again, bringing the entire audience along.



This combination of artistry and enthusiasm makes Buffalo Rose one of the most vital and important groups working today. Rather than play the folk music of the past, the band gleefully combines genres and ideas together to move acoustic music forward to a new, contemporary place without ever losing sight of its roots. Fans of Lake Street Dive, Nickel Creek, and Punch Brothers will find much to like in this crew. Anyone seeking compelling new acoustic music needs to join Buffalo Rose in the future right now.



2022 Scottdale Heroes Banner Program

After several years of witnessing the commemorative banners in many local communities in our area, Joe Levandosky and Kathy Lighthall decided it was time to bring the Scottdale Heroes Banner Program to our town in an effort to provide much needed awareness and recognition of our active Military and Veterans and also those who serve us in various community service roles, including local government, firefighters, first responders and others. Former councilman, Jack Davis took the cause to Borough

Council for approval in January 2022 and the work began.

Applications were taken for a six-week period that ran until March 1. Support from the community was overwhelming and 81 utility pole banners were requested, plus 288 garden flags for personal use. To complete the project, all photographs submitted were carefully photoshopped, pole locations were determined, photographed and GPS coordinates were provided to both electric and phone utility companies for approval. Once all banners were received and confirmed correct, the three-foot banners were placed on utility poles by the hard-working members of our Scottdale Volunteer Fire Department. The garden flags were distributed to participants at the Scottdale Gazebo which was surrounded by garden flags of all participants. Those garden flags will remain with the Borough to be placed around town on special occasions in the future. Costs for the utility pole banners and a donation to the Fire Department were generously covered by many local known and anonymous donors.

A commemorative and moving video of all the participants was created and can be found on YouTube (search Scottdale Banner Program) or by going to the dedicated website, Scottdaleheroes.org. In addition to the video, each participant's photo and information is located on the website. These images and biographies will be housed permanently as a historical reference. If anyone wishes to participate in this on-line memorial, they may still do so at any time.

Response to the program has been extremely positive and the downtown area has been greatly enhanced by these banners of tribute. An increased sense of patriotism is now evident in Scottdale. We owe all our local heroes a debt of gratitude for their service to our community.

We would like to sincerely thank everyone for their donations, support and encouragement that helped make the 2022 Scottdale Heroes Banner Program a great success and ESPECIALLY all the family and friends that have made their heroes ours.

Scottdale Historical Society

There are many places, events and activities in Scottdale that bring people together. We worship together, we dine at our local restaurants together, we support our sports teams together, and we gather to celebrate our town together.

Our older generations share memories of dining at the lunch counter in Burns Drug Store, the Nut Shop, Eck's and Tom's Restaurants, cooling off at Briercheck's pool or attending events at Loucks Park in the summertime, skating at Steiner's Rink and going to the Record Den or Mary Lou's for a snack or a bottle of pop with their friends.

Our current generations will talk about their memories of eating at Carson's, Wish's and Wises, meeting their friends at the Scottdale Fireman's Fair, Community Picnic and Fall Festival, and playing softball or tennis at Loucks Park with a stop at Dairy-Haus for ice cream treats after.

Our town has seen its share of changes. In 2022, we razed the Elks Building, located at the corner of Broadway and Market Streets. This location was home to the Campbell Building, which dated back to the 1860s when the town was called Fountain Mills. On the first floor of the Campbell Building, there was a tavern, market, and other retail ventures. H.C. Frick had his first office here and the Independent Newspaper, later known as the Independent Observer, was located on the second floor.

Although we lost that structure to the wrecking ball this year, another was saved by Ms. Pat Hill, of Scottdale, who has a passion for historic preservation and old grand homes. Pat purchased Greystone Manor, located on the corner of North Chestnut and Mulberry Streets, and has been diligent in having the house totally restored.

Originally, this was the site of the Presbyterian Church, which was razed after the new church across the street was built. Circa 1906, E.H. Reid built the grand Georgian revival home known as Reid Hall for his wife and two daughters. The home fell into major disrepair and by 1965 was overgrown, with the massive columns laying on the front lawn. Richard Campbell and his mother, Mary, purchased and restored the property to its former glory. There, they started a decorating business using their years of experience running the Campbell Department Store, located where the Kapr Memorial Parklet is today. Sixty years of industrial soot and time had turned the buff stone to a dark grey color, giving the Campbells the inspiration to call the home Greystone. History repeated itself and the structure fell into major disrepair yet again.

The passion, concern and praise from the community regarding the Greystone property has not gone unnoticed. Ms. Hill is humbled by everyone coming together to say thank you for saving this historic landmark and the offers to help in many ways. Pat plans to share many of the archives left in the home with the town as she preserves this structure for generations to come.

The Scottdale Historical Society would like to give their thanks and appreciation for the work that Pat is doing at Greystone Manor and for those in the community involved in the restoration.

The fond memories that many of us share of Scottdale makes me wonder... What will our town be like in 10 or 50 years? If I had to leave Scottdale, what are things I would miss the most? What do I most enjoy

about our town today? What has our community lost that most matters to you?

The Scottdale Historical Society would love to see your responses. These are great questions to ponder as Scottdale prepares to celebrate its 150th anniversary in 2024.
