

From Fountain Mills to Scottdale Borough

In 1874, the community previously known as Fountain Mills incorporated as a borough. Although the new borough would take on the name Scottdale, it had earned its name Fountain Mills honestly. The small community growing along Jacobs Creek in the mid-1800s had several mills. But none for steel. Grist and flour mills for feed, flour, and whiskey made use of grain that would otherwise rot or be ruined by pests. Even as early as the 1790s and early 1800s, mills and distilleries dotted the area, operated by Smiths, Stricklers, Chains, Snyders, Stauffers, Hursts, Stoners, and of course Overholts. Whiskey distilling in Scottdale trickled on throughout the century but it became an admirable industry in neighboring West Overton and throughout western PA. Fountain Mills also boasted a saw mill for new construction in the area and a carding mill for preparing wool into workable yarn.

By the mid-1800s, those small businesses along Jacobs Creek in Fountain Mills had grown and some began to shift. Many of the early Fountain Mills families were entrepreneurs and followed the changing tide of business. In 1859, J. R. Stauffer & Co. built a grist mill known as Dexter but when coal and coke erupted in the 1870s, the family entered the coking business and milling ended.

This shift in dominant industries, new businesses, and its location put Fountain Mills in a strong position. By 1872, the town was becoming a hub for regional industrial activity as coal mines, coke works, and steel mills opened. A year later, the largest corporation in the world, the Pennsylvania Railroad, opened a new branch in Fountain Mills. The next year, the community named its new borough after the PARR president, Thomas Scott. After weathering an economic depression in 1877, Scottdale became the largest manufacturing town in the county by the early 1900s.

Chuck Blasko and The Vogues

Pittsburgh, USA and Internationally. He is the ONLY member of the original group who has kept the name alive since it's inception. In May 2023, Chuck will be celebrating his 58th year in show business and is the ONLY PERFORMER today to lay claim to this fame! Today, Chuck still loves doing what he does best and that is performing and entertaining. He enjoys talking with fans before and after their shows. His shows continue to please the crowds with a variety of music for fans and people of all ages. Chuck will be joined by Sean Moran - High Tenor, Timmy Scott - Second Tenor, Ricky Guzik - Percussion, and Bert Farkas - Bass.

Ruff House

Brad Abbott is a '90s/2000s influenced singer songwriter from Jeannette PA, Ruff House is a five-piece band from Pittsburgh, PA, playing music that spans the generations - from classic rock and '90s, to pop,

blues and even a little country! Band members Rob Capozzolo - drum Paul Kazior - guitar and harmonica Lacey Thurner - lead singer Matthew Thurner - guitar Dave Balzama - bass and vocals

Fun fact: Paul originally started Ruff House many years ago. His daughter, Lacey, joined the band when she was only 13 years old and introduced her husband, Matt, to the band several years later.

<u>Norman Nardini</u>

As bass player for the 1970s Pittsburgh rock n' roll band, Diamond Reo, Norman Nardini got his career started. After a very brief stay at Berklee School Of Music and more than a few special moments. Nardini played bass on "The Pennsylvania Polka" Steeler fight song. After doing an arrangement of "Dancing In The Street" that got picked up by RCA he did an arrangement of Marvin Gaye's "Ain't That Peculiar" that brought an album deal with Big Tree Records that got Diamond Reo started.

A highly talented, underground group from Wheeling, West Virginia, The Brett Cain Band, worked with Nardini to create some legendary music in the late 90s

that resulted in their LP, Rise. As leader of The Pittsburgh Blues Allstars, Nardini has led their performance at the Pittsburgh Blues Festival for the last 13 years, shows that have featured the best of the 'burg Shari Richards, Billy Price, Gary Beloma, Kenny Blake Mark Stutso, and Jill West. The late great Glenn Pavone played his last show with The Allstars at the Blues Fest. With Harry Bottom as Bass player and BG vovals, Mike Floccari on drums, and Larry Siefers on keyboards and tenor sax.

The Jaggerz

When you mention The Jaggerz to a Pittsburgher, chances are that person will burst into a chorus of 'THE RAPPER'. From the 'Club Natural' in Beaver Falls PA to Dick Clarks 'AMERICAN BANDSTAND' in Hollywood CA was a long way off, but Benny Faiella, Donnie Iris, Jimmie Ross, Bill Maybray, Tom Davies and Jim Pugliano Collectively known as The Jaggerz, made it.

After playing the club circuit seven nights a week, they broke into the college market. After a few summers at the Ohio Resort Geneva on the Lake, The Jaggerz still found time to write and polish their craft.

In 1968, Gamble Records of Philadelphia signed the band to it's first recording contract. Their first album 'INTRODUCING THE JAGGERZ' spawned their first two regional hits 'Baby I Love You' and 'Gotta Find My Way Back Home'.

Other artists with Gamble Records at the time were Jerry Butler, Dusty Springfield, The Intruders, Soul Survivor's, The Jays and Harold Melvin and the Blue Notes with Teddy Pendergrass.

In 1970, the band signed with Buddah/Kama Sutra Records in New York, where they recorded their second album 'WE WENT TO DIFFERENT SCHOOLS TOGETHER'. After nine weeks on the charts, their song 'THE RAPPER' edged out Brook Benton's "Rainy Night in Georgia" and Simon & Garfunkel's "Bridge Over Troubled Water". In March of that year, the band received their gold record for having the #1 SONG IN THE COUNTRY.

The Jaggerz have recorded 11 singles and seven albums/CDs including one with legendary radio personality the late Wolfman Jack. They also produced and recorded BOBBY RYDELL and JAMES (MOON DOGGIE) DARREN for their own production company, SIXUVUS REVIVAL MUSIC. Their latest CDs are: 'AND THE BAND PLAYED ON', 'RE-RAPPED BY REQUEST and 'THE WALK'. In 2009, RAP stars, 'Wiz Khalifa and 'The Game', used a sample of the Jaggerz song 'Memoirs of the Traveler off their 2nd album 'WE WENT TO DIFFERENT SCHOOLS TOGETHER'

Original members, Jimmie Ross & Benny Faiella along with Hermi Granati (keyboards), Chris Patarini (sax), Paul Martello (drums) and Dennis McAbee (guitar) carry on the bands signature sound of great harmonies.


Coming together for the first time as a four-piece band in 2016, their primary goal was to present songs from the Beatles psychedelic era onward, bringing together musical sensibilities

Billy Price

2016 Blues Music Award (BMA) Winner and frequent BMA nominee Billy Price first attracted national attention during his three-year association with guitarist Roy Buchanan. Price is the vocalist on two of Buchanan's LPs, That's What I'm Here For and Live Stock. Since then, with the Keystone Rhythm Band, the Billy Price Band, and solo projects, Billy Price has recorded and released a total of 20 albums, CDs, and DVDs.

Price's album, This Time for Real with the late Chicago soul singer Otis Clay, received a 2016 Blues Music Award in the category of best soul blues album. He received BMA nominations in 2019 (Reckoning) and 2020 (Dog Eat Dog) for best soul blues album, and in 2020, 2022, and 2023 for best male soul blues artist.

In 2022, he released a 3-CD compilation retrospective of his career on GetHip Recordings titled '50+ Years of Soul.'

The Billy Price Band, based in Billy's hometown of Pittsburgh, Pa., consists of Dave Dodd (drums), Tom Valentine (bass), Lenny Smith (guitar), Jim Britton (keyboards), Eric Spaulding (sax), and Joe Herndon (trumpet). They won the Pittsburgh City Paper Reader's Poll in 2021 and 2022 as the top blues band in the city.

Scottdale Public Library

As the Scottdale community approaches its 150th anniversary, it is important to note that for 114 of those years the community has had the benefit of a public library, free to the people of the community.

Beginning in 1910, A.L. Keister and his brothers, B.F. Keister, Fenton O. Keister, and Albert Keister, saw the benefit of having a library available to the residents of the community. The gift of a library was originally made on March 23, 1910 and opened to the public on November 7, 1910 with Miss Daisy Mary Smith as first librarian. The library was maintained by the Keister family and supplemented by the school board until A.L. Keister's death. Then the residents of Scottdale, realizing its worth to the community, enthusiastically voted to support the library.



On August 1, 1921, the library was moved from the high school into the Funaro building on Pittsburgh Street until a permanent home could be found. On November 1, 1922, the library was moved to the second floor of the Hurst – Cook Building, later known as the Brennan Building owned by Richard Cossel. In 1967, the library again moved across the street to the Marion Eicher Building at 231 Pittsburgh St. Through the years, the library expanded as adjoining space became available to include 235 Pittsburgh St.

In 1999, Library Director Patricia Miller was contacted by Glenn and Carole Johnson who learned of the need for a children's room at the library. The Johnsons, longtime friends of the library, provided funding to renovate an adjoining space and create a much-needed Children's Room in memory of their daughter Beth Ann. This year also saw the completion of the retrospective conversion of the library records to an automated operating system.

The year 2008 became an important year as the library opened the doors of its permanent home at 106 Spring Street. After many years of fundraising, grant writing, and hard work, the new library was ready to begin its last move. Residents of all ages formed a two-day book brigade and carried every item by hand to the new building. This was a glorious culmination of a wonderful Board of Directors who worked under the leadership of President Judith Ermine, Library Director Patricia Miller, and Assistant Library Director Rhonda Allison. Board member Dr. David Bigley oversaw much of the actual building of the library with architect James Gayton. Two years later, the beautiful Reading Garden was opened to the public and dedicated to the fulfill our library mission: In support of an informed citizenry, Scottdale Public Library provides printed and recorded materials, programs, equipment and staff services to meet the community's educational, professional and recreational needs. The library strives to enrich and empower every patron by fostering a love of reading.

As the borough celebrates 150 years, we hope the library continues to be an instrument for good in our community.
